Once regeneration occurs in us, a divine nature is formed within us. Yielding to this nature frees us from the dictate of our senses, and we are empowered to do so by His Spirit and God's revealed Word.

And because of his glory and excellence, he has given us great and precious promises. These are the promises that enable you to share his divine nature and escape the world's corruption caused by human desires. 2 Peter 1:4 NLT

The Apostle Peter warns us not to revert back to living according to our own desires that formerly controlled us. One of the strongest cravings we must deny and crucify is self-preservation. It's the core motivation behind projecting ourselves to be perceived favorable by others. Peter warned that we will be unfavorably judged, either in this life or the next, if we yield to these cravings. Conversely, we'll be rewarded for closely adhering to God's desires.

So you must live as God's obedient children. Don't slip back into your old ways of living to satisfy your own desires. You didn't know any better then. But now you must be holy in everything you do, just as God who chose you is holy. For the Scriptures say, "You must be holy because I am holy." And remember that the heavenly Father to whom you pray has no favorites. He will judge or reward you according to what you do. So you must live in reverent fear of him during your time here as "temporary residents." I Peter 1:14-17 NLT

### Everyone Deserves a New Day

#### CHARLIE KIRK AND OUR DUTY AS WATCHMEN

Wednesday was a tragic moment for America. As we grieve the devastating loss of Turning Point USA founder and CEO Charlie Kirk, a husband, father and advocate for truth, we also stand as fellow brothers and sisters in Christ, acknowledging the dutiful role Kirk played as a 'watchman' in the Kingdom of God. Kirk, unapologetic in his faith and stances for justice, boldly journeyed to college campuses across America to amplify these messages of truth.

Likewise, the prophet Ezekiel was given a sobering assignment. God told him, "Son of man, I have made you a watchman." If Ezekiel saw danger coming and failed to sound the alarm, he would be held accountable for the blood that followed. If he warned the people, and they refused to listen, he was not guilty, for he had fulfilled his duty.

That calling belongs to us as Christians today. We can learn so much from both Ezekiel and Charlie Kirk. In every generation God raises up watchmen to warn, to speak and to stand for truth. Silence is not neutral. Silence is participation. It is a choice that leaves grounds wide open, vulnerable to enemy control and takeover. When we see danger approaching, whether it is moral decay, spiritual compromise or outright violence, and we refuse to speak, then we share in the consequences. We must always stand up for justice and righteousness.

Charlie Kirk's death is a reminder of why this role matters. He was not perfect, but he was willing to speak of his conviction with clarity. He knew who he was, and he knew where he was going. That assurance comes from Christ alone.

Forgiveness is part of this calling. We cannot warn faithfully, acting in truth and love, if our hearts are consumed with bitterness. Forgiveness is obedience, and it is also repentance. When we forgive, we turn away from our natural instinct for vengeance and turn back to God who has forgiven us. That obedience allows us to stand on the wall with a clear conscience, proclaiming truth without hypocrisy.

Being watchmen, like Ezekiel and Charlie Kirk, may cost us dearly. It may cost us friends, careers, comfort and even life itself. But God has not asked us to control the results or live in fear. He has asked us to be faithful, even to the point of death. Philippians 1:21 reminds us: "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain."

Like Ezekiel, our duty is to speak. And like Charlie, our confidence rests not in how people respond, but in knowing who we are in Christ and where we are going when this life is over. In truth and love, we must always stand. Let us be watchmen who sound the alarm. Let us forgive as Christ has forgiven us. Let us speak truth boldly and clearly, knowing that in the end God holds us accountable not for the outcome, but for our obedience.

Vice President JD Vance personally accompanied Charlie Kirk's body from Utah back home to Arizona — a touching final tribute in a long friendship that helped launch the former President Trump critic into the White House and onto the international stage. Vance cancelled plans to attend a 9/11 commemoration at Ground Zero in Manhattan at the last minute Thursday, opting instead to travel to Utah with his wife, Usha, aboard Air Force 2 to be with Kirk's family and friends.

#### LONDON HAS MASSIVE ATTENDANCE FOR MARCH, FESTIVAL, & RALLY

Over 1 million (some indicate 3 million) gather in London on September 13, 2025, for Tommy Robinson's "Unite the Kingdom" march, which transformed into a massive memorial for Charlie Kirk. The event, the largest far-right rally in Britain in decades, tributes like a moment of silence, and bagpipe performances.

Erika Kirk, vowed to expand his patriotic mission amid polarized global reactions, including condemnations from figures like Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, "This was a cold-blooded murder. Charlie allowed anyone to debate him, because he was convinced of his ideas, and he was killed for it."
