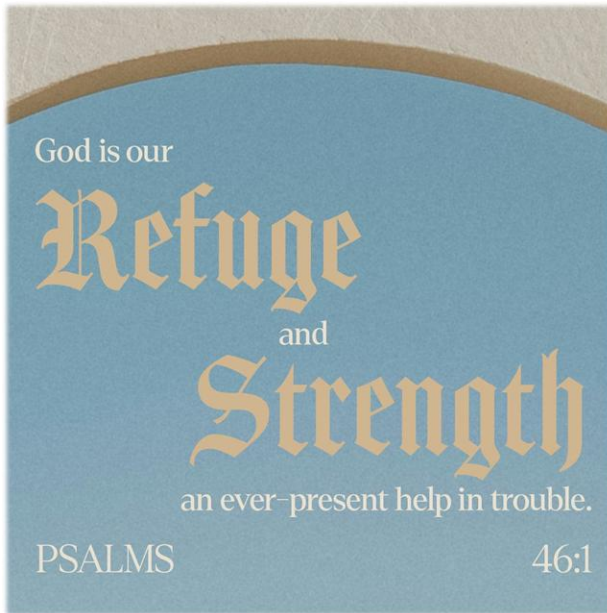

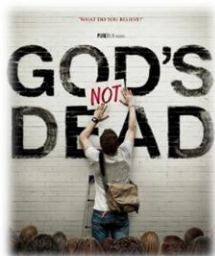

Spokane Washington - In a matter of like 30 minutes everything just blew up. The fire jumped the river. The police were going door to door, saying, 'Get out now.' There was lots of smoke, and ash was falling from the sky.

The wildfires that blazed through Spokane, Washington, destroyed more than 800 structures. Like many residents of the area, they thought they would be coming back to an intact home. Instead, they return to a ruin of ashes.

SAFE ACROSS THE WATER DEVOTION

Then they cried out to the Lord in their trouble, and he brought them out of their distress. He stilled the storm to a whisper; the waves of the sea were hushed. They were glad when it grew calm, and he guided them to their desired haven. Psalm 107:28-30

The oars were heavy, splintered, and worn down by hours of desperate rowing against a relentless headwind. Every muscle in the body screamed in protest, and the shore of safety felt just as far away as it had hours ago when the squall first hit. There comes a point in every grueling season where human strength completely runs out, leaving nothing behind but aching hands and a quiet despair. The temptation in that exhausted silence is to believe that the boat is going to sink right there in the middle of nowhere, abandoned to the mercy of an unforgiving sea.

Understanding the sovereignty of God is imperative when going through a personal trial, for God has a timeline for every trial. It will, in fact, come to an end if we trust Him through it. We see this powerfully when Jesus was in the storm with the disciples. After He rebuked them for their little faith, they immediately found themselves on the other side of the lake. What should have taken the straining, work, and ambition of the disciples was immediately accomplished by one word from the Savior. Jesus did not just calm the storm. Jesus advanced them supernaturally, carrying them past the toil and right into safety.

He does the same thing for us today. When we look at the scriptural concept of waiting on the Lord, it often feels entirely passive, like sitting idly by while life passes. But when you actually dissect the word wait in the scriptures, it reflects the same underlying action as weaving rope. Rope is formed by weaving weak strands together to make a strong one. The same process applies to seasons of waiting. We are taking our thin, fragile strand of faith and weaving it through trust with the heart of the Father's imperishable string. It is the opposite of passivity. It is intentional, active, and requires deep perseverance.

The result of waiting on the Lord is that we do get to the end of our trials. Not only that, but the Lord will advance us beyond what we could ever accomplish within our own strength.

The practical application of this truth hits home during the middle of a frantic week. When a problem refuses to budge, and exhaustion sets in, the instinct is to try harder, push longer, and fix everything through sheer willpower. But true rest means dropping the oars. It means recognizing that trusting Him is actually the most productive thing a person can do. Instead of straining against the current of an impossible situation, the heart learns to weave its weakness into His strength, letting His sovereign timeline guide the way forward. Oh friend, this trial will come to an end.

Reflection - The next time you feel completely exhausted from trying to force a breakthrough in your own strength, stop rowing. Take a moment to consciously release control, surrendering your timeline to His hands.

Prayer - Lord, You see the exhaustion in my hands and the heavy waters surrounding my life right now. Please forgive me for relying on my own strained efforts instead of trusting Your sovereign timeline. Help me to weave my fragile trust into Your unfailing strength as I wait on You. Thank You for the promise that every storm has an end and that You are guiding me safely to the other side. Amen.

THE SECRET OF SURRENDER – BILLY GRAHAM DEVOTION

Just as you used to be slaves to all kinds of sin, so now you must let yourselves be slaves to all that is right and holy. - Romans 6:19 (TLB)

We have heard the modern expression, “Don’t fight it—it’s bigger than both of us.” Those who are meek do not fight back at life. They learn the secret of surrender, or yielding to God. He then fights for us! Instead of filling your mind with resentments, abusing your body by sinful diversion, and damaging your soul by willfulness, humbly give all over to God. Your conflicts will disappear and your inner tensions will vanish into thin air. Then your life will begin to count for something. You will have the feeling of belonging to life. Boredom will melt away, and you will become vibrant with hope and expectation. Because you are meekly yielded, you will begin to “inherit the earth” of good things, which God holds in store for all who trust Him with their all.

Prayer: Let me yield to You this day, Father, all my innermost thoughts. I cannot hide from You.
