And how does a man benefit if he gains the whole world and loses his soul in the process? For is anything worth more than his soul? - Mark 8:36,37 (TLB)

In the world in which we live, we give most attention to satisfying the appetites of the body and practically none to the soul. Consequently, we are one-sided. We become fat physically and materially, while spiritually we are lean, weak and anemic. The soul actually demands as much attention as the body. It demands fellowship and communion with God. It demands worship, quietness, and meditation. Unless the soul is fed and exercised daily, it becomes weak and shriveled. It remains discontented, confused, restless. Many people turn to alcohol to try to drown the crying and longing of the soul. Some turn to a new sex experience. Others attempt to quiet the longings of their souls in other ways. But nothing but God ever completely satisfies, because the soul was made for God, and without God it is restless and in secret torment.

Prayer: Dear Lord, I thank You that when my soul cried out for forgiveness and love, You were there. Today help me to live as Your child should.

A GARMENT THAT OUTLASTS THE STORM

To appoint unto them that mourn in Zion, to give unto them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness; that they might be called trees of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that he might be glorified. Isaiah 61:3

A family was driving home under a slate gray sky when the phone call arrived. The news hit with sudden force, shattering the quiet routine of the afternoon and bringing an unimaginable reality into the car. There was no time to shield the children in the back seat from the immediate shock. As the weight of the moment settled over the front seats, the parents wept freely over the sudden grief. But before despair could take root, something extraordinary happened. Through their tears, the mother and father lifted their hands toward the windshield and began to whisper, "Lord, You are still good."

Putting on the garment of praise.

In that raw, unfiltered space, those children witnessed a masterclass in faith. They learned a lesson that no Sunday school lesson could ever fully convey. Scripture tells us in Psalm 34:1, "I will bless the Lord at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth." Yet living out that verse when life unravels requires a deliberate shift in our posture. When sorrow knocks on our door, our human instinct is to retreat into silence or frustration. **Choosing a different path means teaching our kids that worship is not reserved for easy seasons. It is an anchor thrown out into the deepest water when the waves start crashing.**

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Putting on the spirit of praise takes intentionality because our emotions rarely cooperate with our theology on the darkest days. If your natural personality leans toward quiet processing rather than outward expression, stepping into praise is an act of sheer will. It means whispering thanks over a burnt dinner, speaking peace into a chaotic hallway, or lifting a quiet prayer of gratitude when the bills outweigh the bank account. As the Apostle Paul reminds us in Romans 12:1, presenting our bodies as a living sacrifice is our spiritual worship. It is choosing to let God's character speak louder than our current circumstance.

When children watch the adults in their lives reach for God instead of panic, their entire view of faith transforms from a set of rules into a lifeline. This is not about masking real pain or pretending that broken things do not hurt. It is about handing the next generation a garment of strength that will keep them warm in peace long after we are gone.

You do not need a monumental crisis to practice the power of praise. It starts with one small, intentional choice in a moment of ordinary friction. The next time a minor delay frustrates you or an unexpected mess derails your afternoon, pause right where you are. Speak a sentence of gratitude out loud for your family to hear, saying something simple like, "Lord, thank You for holding us together right now." By making praise your first reflex in small moments, you train your heart to reach for heaven first when the heavy storms eventually roll in.

Prayer - Lord, we confess that our hearts often grow heavy when unexpected trials disrupt our plans. Forgive us for letting worry drown out our song. Give us the courage to put on the garment of praise even when our hands are trembling and the path ahead is obscured. May our children look at our lives and learn what it means to trust You through every high moment and every valley. Wrap our home in Your unfailing peace, and let our worship be a living testimony of Your goodness. In Jesus' name, amen.

This summer, our team of volunteers took the gifts that God has given them to bless the people of Tulsa through free dental care. We had the opportunity to serve patients, with a total of \$39,592 worth of dental care given at no cost.

The father had been living with severe dental pain but could not afford the care that he needed. Within minutes of treatment, the pain was gone.

As we talked with the family, the mother shared that they were nearly out of gas and didn’t know how they were going to make it home. We were able to provide a gift card for gas, and they were overwhelmed with gratitude.

What began as a dental appointment became an opportunity to meet a practical need and remind this young family that they are seen, valued, and cared for.
